

### What is Dual Credit?

A college course that can be used to simultaneously earn high school <u>and</u> college credit in <u>one</u> class!





### Benefits of Being a Collin College Dual Credit Student

- Courses may count toward high school credit
- Small class sizes
- Educational support from Collin College instructors and support services
- Experience the college environment and rigor of college courses
- Begin a college transcript
- Complete a Certificate
- Cost savings



## How Much Will You Save?

University of Texas at Dallas \$2,857 for a three credit hour course\*

University of North Texas \$1,414.54 for a three credit hour course\*

\*Based on Fall 2023 tuition rates

# Collin College is \$188

(\$186 + \$2/semester record fee) for a three credit hour course (for in-county residents)

## HIGH SCHOOL VS. COLLEGE

### High School

High school is MANDATORY and usually FREE  $\leftarrow$  · · · · · · · · · · College is VOLUNTARY and EXPENSIVE Your time is structured by your TEACHERS 🛛 🛶 • • • • • • • • • • • • • • YOU manage your own time You can count on **PARENTS** and **TEACHERS** deadlines Testing is **FREQUENT** and covers material AS YOU GO ALONG Teachers frequently conduct **REVIEW SESSIONS**, pointing out important concepts Teachers frequently rearrange test dates to **AVOID CONFLICT** with school events You are **NOT** responsible for knowing what you need for graduation your permission

### College

YOU must balance your responsibilities and responsibility for what you do/don't do Testing is **NOT FREQUENT** and covers LARGE amounts of material YOU, not the professor, are expected to **PREPARE YOURSELF** for a test

Professors usually schedule tests WITHOUT **REGARD** for other classes or outside activities Graduation requirements are COMPLEX and differ for each college **ONLY THE STUDENT** can speak with their professor about their class, unless a FERPA waiver has been authorized

### **FERPA**

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act



- Similar to HIPAA law
- Federal law that ensures privacy of student educational records

(begins when student starts college regardless of age)

- Collin College cannot share grades, course schedules, or test scores with parents
- A great opportunity for students to learn the college process and take on new responsibilities
- Students will need to use their Collin email address for communication with instructors





## **Dual Credit Eligibility**

- Students complete the <u>entire</u> Collin College admissions process
- Permission must be obtained from high school counselor before enrollment
- Must meet college readiness standards as defined by Texas Success Initiative (TSI)
- Students must meet both high school and Collin College academic requirements to continue in the dual credit program



## **Application Tips**

- Create an account at applytexas.org (students must use personal email address)
- Once account has been verified, start a new application
- Select Two-year community college

- Student will receive their Collin ID number (CWID), Workday username, and password in <u>three-five business</u> <u>days</u>




## **High School Approval**

- Your high school must approve ALL classes, including non-dual credit classes (concurrent)
- You must have written approval from your high school to make changes to dual credit classes



 Description
 All students who attend a high school with a formal dual credit partnership must complete the <u>Dual Credit Permission</u> Form. Follow your high school's process for submitting your permission form. Once Collin College receives and reviews the approved form from your high school, this action item will no longer appear in your inbox.
 Students must have completed the Collin College admissions application and will receive an action item in their inbox to complete.

### **High School Permission Form**

This form can be completed for their entire enrollment period in Dual Credit unless the student needs to apply for re-admission.

### By signing the below, you certify the following:

I understand that upon enrollment in the Dual Credit Program, I am a college student and am therefore subject to and must comply with Collin College policies, procedures, rules, regulations, and guidelines as well as those of my high school. Tuition must be paid by posted payment deadlines as designated by my high school campus. I also understand that academic information such as enrollment, grades, and test scores will be provided by Collin College to my corresponding high school upon request.

I understand that I will be enrolled in college credit course(s) offered on my high school campus or one of the Collin College campuses. I will receive a letter grade for these courses that will be recorded on my permanent college transcript. A numerical grade will appear on my high school transcript for approved dual credit courses; conversion of these grades is the responsibility of the respective high school. It is my responsibility to verify the transferability of courses with higher education institutions of choice.

I understand that eligibility for participation in this program requires college level readiness met through the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) or testing waivers through the PSAT-MMSQT, ACT-Aspire, or STAAR scores. Students may also earn testing exemptions through qualifying SAT or ACT scores. Information regarding testing scores can be found online on the <u>Collin College TSI FAQs</u> webpage. I understand that I am not eligible for KINE (Kinesiology) or developmental education courses for dual/concurrent credit. If I register for these courses, I understand that they will be dropped from my schedule.

I fully understand and acknowledge that if I wish to drop or withdraw from a college course(s), it is my responsibility to first discuss this matter with my high school counselor. Upon approval, my counselor will notify Collin College of the request to drop or withdraw me from my course(s).

I understand that if enrolled in dual/concurrent credit course(s) taught on a Collin College campus, I will be required to provide proof of a valid meningitis vaccine or exemption at least 10 days prior to the start of the course. - The TSI is designed to measure college readiness in ELAR (reading and writing) and mathematics
- It is used for course placement purposes
- Students must be at college level in ELAR for the majority of courses

## TSI: What Will I Need to Do?

### If you are taking the TSI through Collin:

- Complete **Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA)**
- Review email from <u>assessments@Collin.edu</u> regarding testing procedures
- Pay at the cashier's office or online. The cost is **\$29.**
- In-Person testing is available at any campus Testing Center by Appointment
- Online testing is offered through a virtual testing platform. The current cost is \$40.
- Visit our <u>TSI Testing webpage</u> on Collin's website for more details
- If you are taking the TSI through Rockwall ISD, please contact yasamyne.korban@rockwallisd.org. You will need to complete a different Pre- Assessment Activity, pay through Revtrack and must take your assessment at the Burton Academy.



### **Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination**

Dual Credit students taking classes <u>at any Collin</u> <u>campus</u> MUST provide proof of vaccination within five years or documentation of an exemption if they are under the age of 22. The vaccination must be administered at least <u>10</u> days prior to start of the student's entering term.

Dual Credit students taking classes away from a Collin College campus are eligible for an exemption by completing and signing the HS permission form.

Description	To enroll in classes taught in-person at a Collin College location you must either submit your: 1) official shot record (administered at least 10 days before term start) and cannot be older than 5 years, 2) proof of medical exemption from your physician, OR 3) conscientious objection using the required <u>Texas Department of State Health Service Exemption from</u> <u>Meningococcal Vaccination Requirements for Reasons of Conscience form.</u>
	This documentation must be submit directly to Med+Proctor: <u>Click here to submit</u> . The documentation will be reviewed by Med+Proctor within 2 business days. Once <u>approved</u> by Med+Proctor, this action item will no lon appear in your inbox. You can use the same link to sign back into your <u>Med+Proctor account</u> to review the review status of your submitted document.

# 3. Registration



## **Registration Details**

For Dual Credit and Concurrent Classes

All students will be registered by the P-12 Partnerships Office

- High schools will provide P-12 Partnerships an approved list of students, courses and class periods for registration
- P-12 Partnerships will register and notify students of registration and payment deadline
- Students are responsible for viewing their Collin College schedule and submitting payment by high school stated payment deadline
- Students may not be added back into dual credit courses if dropped for nonpayment (based on ISD policy)



# 4. Payment





## Tuition

 $117^*$  per credit hour for students residing out-of-county = 351 for a three credit hour course

Total cost includes a \$2 per semester student records fee per hour. \*All fees are subject to change upon approval of the Collin Board of Trustees\* Courses with First Day Access Textbooks will have textbook costs included in tuition fees.

Tuition is paid per semester.

Students eligible for Free/Reduced Lunch will have their cost of tuition waived by Collin College.


